-  Hobby Lobby is purchasing the Northfield campus, formerly used by Northfield Mount Hermon School, which consolidated in 2005 to a single location in Mount Hermon, Mass. The Northfield campus will become the home of C.S. Lewis College, a College of Great Books and Visual and Performing Arts.
-  Hobby Lobby is committed to investing \$5 million for operations and capital improvement projects in support of the creation of C.S. Lewis College
-  Hobby Lobby is a privately held arts and crafts retail chain created by CEO and founder David Green in 1972
-  Hobby Lobby has more than 430 stores in 35 states
-  The company has approximately 18,000 employees nationwide
-  Revenue in 2008 was \$1.8 billion. Hobby Lobby carries no long-term debt and is closed on Sundays.
-  Hobby Lobby's headquarters are located in a 3.4 million-square-foot manufacturing, distribution and office complex in Oklahoma City
-  Hobby Lobby operates their company in a manner consistent with Biblical principles
-  Hobby Lobby participates in ministry efforts worldwide
-  Affiliated companies include: Crafts Etc., Hemispheres and Mardel
-  In 2007, David Green purchased former Bradford College in Haverhill, Massachusetts, and gave the property to Zion Bible College
-  In 2007, Hobby Lobby donated \$70 million to Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Oklahoma, to eliminate more than \$50 million of debt and assist in the reformation of the school's leadership and infrastructure
